FUNDRAISING RESULTS FOR FISCAL YEAR 2022-23






AMOUNT RAISED FOR THE GREATER GOUCHER FUND (GGF)






FY23 GGF RE-ENGAGED RATE WAS 13% OF DONORS FROM FY18-21 (335 DONORS)
